According to Jon Jory, Artistic Director of Actors Theatre of Louisville, a one-act play can generate tremendous energy and can stick in the mind of the audience for a lifetime. It illuminates moments of profound change and realization. It has a cocky, "in-your-face" attitude that grabs and holds our attention. It's also a valuable actor's and director's teaching tool. They demand much of the same preparation a longer role or play might take, but have the advantages of minimum production requirements and shorter rehearsal periods. One-act plays make demands but don't overwhelm. For the student director, they create a range of tasks and responsibilities in miniature. For the student actor, they surpass scenes because they are whole, not parts of a play. <u>With this in mind. respond thoughtfully to the following:</u>
